



CTR PRAYER PROJECT

Romans 12:21-Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good.

Nearly every day, I receive emails that attempt to retaliate for some of the evil taking place in our country of late. Some are in jest, but others are meant to demean or harm those who have initiated hate or offended someone. When our hearts and minds take all this in, sooner or later we begin to think along the same lines, and our thoughts determine our behavior. When I used to complain to my parents about bullies or mean-spirited classmates saying hurtful things to me, my parents always reminded me that “sticks and stones could break my bones, but names would never hurt me.” Today, more and more young people are being taught or encouraged to retaliate. There’s a desire to “get even” but getting even often involves taking the offense one step further. And retaliation only serves to lower us to the level of the original perpetrator. It does nothing to clear the air or relieve the tension. In Deuteronomy 32:35, God told the Israelites, “Vengeance is mine, and retribution.” We don’t seem willing to wait and let God have His retribution. We want to do it for Him, and lay everything to rest, but God has a good reason for waiting. As Christians, we know God is in full control of all that is going on. As Christians, we are called upon to follow Christ, not lead Him. As Christians, we are called to be like Christ, and we know He never retaliated, never avenged any wrongdoing. In fact, He died to forgive us of all wrongdoing. So, what should we be doing when we see evil deeds being carried out, not only in our nation, but throughout the world? Do we turn on our computers and pass it along via the Internet? Do we text our friends to make sure they are fully aware of the offense? Do we lie awake, dreaming up ways to return the evil? We can do all of these and more, but if we truly want to bring an end to all this, we need to lay it all before the throne of the Almighty, admit we ourselves have no power or capability of dealing with it, and pray that the solution and end to all this evil will bring honor and glory to the One who so graciously endured evil Himself. Amen?

Praying in One Accord-When it comes to retribution, we can either be in one accord with the world, or with our Lord.

Accord Prayer-Lord Christ, You have shown us Your plan for revenge; give us the patience we need to wait for Your timing and Your will to be done. In Your Name we pray. Amen.
