

CTR PRAYER PROJECT

Revelation 21:1 and 4-Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth passed away, and there is no longer any sea... and He will wipe away every tear from their eyes; and there will no longer be any death; there will no longer be any mourning or crying, or pain; the first things have passed away.

If we haven't spoken it, many of us are likely thinking it: I sure wish life could go back to the way it was when I was a kid. There was no need to lock doors or build fences. There was no smog. Cars didn't need seat belts or car seats. Most people attended churches. Policemen were our friends. There was little or no racial division. To get a divorce was a difficult undertaking ("No Fault" didn't exist yet). Neighbors all knew each other. Pre-teens and teens could get a part-time job nearly anywhere. Most mothers didn't work outside the home, or had only part-time or volunteer positions. It was "Happy Days" for most youngsters. What a difference between then and now! It makes me think of Adam and Eve and the difference between their lives before and after the Fall. Before the Fall, all was good; after the Fall, all was cursed by God. Before the Fall, Adam and Eve were given every provision they needed; after the Fall, the ground was cursed, food supply demanded constant manual labor, thorns and thistles appeared amongst their crops, jealousy and murder were conceived, and all access to the Garden and to an intimate relationship with Him were cut off by God. Sin has its consequences. We tend to forget that we are living in a world that is suffering from the consequences of sin. We forget that Satan's time here is growing shorter and shorter day by day, and he is desperately trying to thwart God's goodness every way he can before Christ returns and renders him helpless. We worry that the world as we know it is being completely destroyed, but Rev. 21:1 doesn't say that our world will be annihilated. It says that everything will become new--just like it was in the beginning, when God created everything out of nothing. Our evil planet will be completely cleansed by God and made ready for the Bride of the Lamb--His Church. It will be beyond our wildest imagination--more beautiful than our eyes have ever beheld. And for those of us who have witnessed happy days become not-so-happy days, not a tear will be shed, because we will never again wish for things to be the way they were after our Fall from grace. In Christ, all things will be made new. I can hardly wait. How about you?

Praying in One Accord-In the beginning, it was God's plan for earth and its inhabitants to be in one accord with one another; now we must pray for it to be so when Christ returns.

Accord Prayer-Lord Christ give us patience and perseverance as we live out the consequences of sin and as we eagerly await the new heaven and earth You are preparing for us. In Your Name we pray. Amen.

Prayer of Thanksgiving-Father God, thank You for revealing a glimpse of the future through Your servant, John; thank You for the plans You have for earth when all is made new under Christ's rule. Amen.

Rediscovering God's Gift of Joy

In October of 1999, the Rev. Mike Mason began a 90 day experiment in joy. He shares many insights, discoveries and experiences of this 90 day experiment in his book *Champagne for the Soul*.
