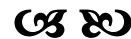

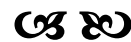

CtR Prayer Project

Psalm 62:5-8-My soul, wait in silence for God only, for my hope is from Him. He only is my rock and my salvation, my stronghold; I shall not be shaken. On God, my salvation and my glory rest; the rock of my strength, my refuge, is in God. Trust in Him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before Him; God is a refuge for us.

Most of us are unfamiliar with the term "refugee". We were born here in the USA and have enjoyed its many freedoms our entire lives: Freedom of speech, freedom of religion, freedom of the press, freedom of assembly, and the right to petition the government. These guaranteed freedoms make us the envy of the rest of the world. Many, my ancestors included, fled their native countries and came to America as refugees. They sought refuge in a land whose God was their God and whose citizens not only respected and worshiped that God, but also respected and cared for each other. Our hearts are aching as we observe those freedoms being abused, and we wonder if, and when, the pendulum will swing the other way. (I read a newspaper article recently that questioned how these basic freedoms can be protected in a nation that is turning its back on God.) Is your heart heavy? Are you carrying burdens too weighty for yourselves? What is weighing heavily on your heart and causing you to fear your next step? What is it that you either haven't placed at the feet of Jesus, or that you can't bring yourself to unload on your heavenly Father? Verse 8 of Psalm 62 tells us God is our refuge. Do we think we need one? Or, are we trying to carry the load ourselves and/or holding a pity party? We need to be willing to dump our load daily---not to inform God about what is troubling us---He already knows---but to remind us that our loving God is with us every step of the way---whether it be through those troubles or around them. God is Spirit. We can't see Him, but we can trust that He cares about us and is putting things in place to ease our burdens, when we show a willingness to let go of them. This has been a tough year, in more ways than one. God wants to lighten our load and draw us to Him, our Refuge, for rest and

refreshment. I think it's time for us to become refugees, don't you?

Praying in One Accord-When we are neither praying in one accord with our Lord, nor living in one accord with Him, we cannot expect our burdens to be lightened by Him.

Accord Prayer-Lord Christ, You took the burden of all mankind's sin to the Cross with You; help keep our burdens from leading us into sin, and help us place those burdens at the foot of Your Cross. In Your Name we pray. Amen.

Prayer of Thanksgiving-Faithful Father, thank You for lightening our loads when we bring them to You; thank You for being our refuge when the weight of the world is upon us. Amen.
