CtR Prayer Project

Matthew 5:10-Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

While I was growing up in a small town in Southern California, I wasn't popular. I wasn't cute. I wasn't athletic. I was rather mousy. Did I wish I were like those popular girls? Of course, but I never felt persecuted as a commoner. Most of my friends were Christians, and our lives were full and happy, in spite of wearing hand-me-downs and not having cabins or beach houses to move to in the summer months. The attitudes my parents taught me were similar to what most parents were teaching their children: Beauty is as beauty does; Sticks and stones may break your bones, but names will never hurt you; Do to others as you would want them to do to you; Borrowing without returning is called stealing. I'm sure you could add more to this list. Never in a million years did I expect that later in life, all the things I was taught would be turned topsy turvy---that children in school would be taught to hate the children in their classroom with skin color that didn't match theirs. That people would burn down the businesses in their towns and there would be no consequences. That the end justifies the means. That rainbows would no longer represent God's promise never again to destroy the earth with a flood. That people would call for God's Name to be omitted from the Pledge of Allegiance and other oaths. I'm beginning to feel like an outcast. And yet, as I look back at the Gospels, I see that most of the people Jesus spent time with and helped during His 30+ years here on earth were outcasts. His birth was first announced to shepherds who were forbidden to worship in the synagogues and temple. He chose fishermen as his closest friends and followers. He healed the prostitutes, demoniacs, and even the hated Romans. The woman at the well was not only a Samaritan, but also an outcast among her own people, yet Jesus chose to share the Good News with her, and as a result, many in her village came to know Jesus and were saved. I read a devotion this morning in Mornings with Jesus where Sharon Hinck wrote of Paul suffering in chains. Many of us are feeling as though we are in chains. Unable to move about as we are used to doing. Unable to touch and give hugs to our loved ones. And even our tongues seem to be in chains---unable to speak freely about what we believe or think. But what did Paul do while in chains? He used the opportunity to minister to the prison guards and those in chains alongside him. Sharon's point? Paul knew the purpose for those chains. He was in chains for Christ! Are you feeling bound up like Paul? Are you sharing a desire for hugging and talking freely about all the thoughts that are going through your mind? Are you feeling anxious and/or depressed over the pandemic or over the state of affairs in our country? Focus, instead, on the purpose for your chains. What does God want you to do for Him while You are temporarily "in prison"? Does He want you to share the Good News through a letter? Does He want you to brighten someone else's day with a phone call? Does He want you to make your favorite recipe and take it to someone who would otherwise be opening a can? We can't all preach like Paul, but we all have special talents and gifts we can share with others for Christ. Instead of wallowing in selfpity, we must learn to use our chains for His glory. Amen?

Praying in One Accord-When our suffering becomes an opportunity for total surrender to the will of God, we are in one accord with the purpose for which He has placed us in chains.

Accord Prayer-Lord Christ, instead of complaining about the inconveniences, the name-calling, and the limitations placed on us during this difficult time, help us seek the purpose You have for allowing these at this time in our lives; and let us remember that our chains are for You! In Your Name we pray. Amen

Prayer of Thanksgiving-Heavenly Father, as parents, there is nothing we wouldn't do to ease our children's pain, comfort them in distress, and listen to their woes; thank You for being our Father and for always being ready and willing to do the same for us. Amen.
