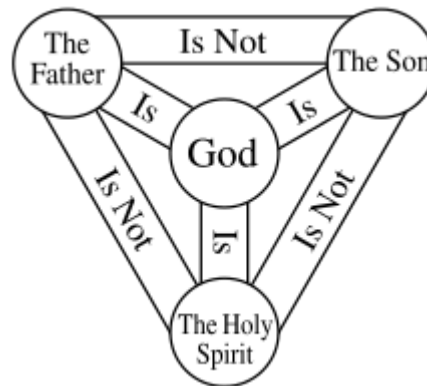


The GriefShare program will begin **Tuesday, June 8**, at **6:30 p.m.** in our multipurpose room (library/classroom).

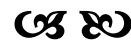
The 13-week program is for people who have lost a family member or friend. There is a \$20 cost for the workbook. Please contact the office if you will be attending to ensure adequate supplies.

The shield of the Trinity, a visual representation of the doctrine of the Trinity, derived from the Athanasian Creed.



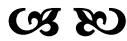

Acts 1:8-But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth.

Have you ever thought of becoming a missionary? My husband and I love to travel and visit places of interest, but when I was growing up, my family didn't travel much. We didn't go on camping trips. We didn't go to exotic, out-of-the-way places. We didn't have foreign exchange students living with us. So now I much prefer a comfortable hotel room, a rental car at my disposal, and eating things that I can easily identify. The thought of being a missionary conjures up for me thoughts of jungles, canoes, picking feathers off a chicken, boiling my drinking water, and putting up with pesky mosquitoes. God made foreign languages easy for me to learn, so I don't think communication would be a problem, and I'm familiar with God's Word, so I wouldn't have trouble sharing about Christ. It's mostly the discomforts and lack of conveniences that I'm not used to and that lead me to other ministry options, instead. But as I read Acts 1:8 again this morning, it became apparent that Jesus had instructed His disciples not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait for "what the Father had promised"---that they would be baptized with the Holy Spirit and would receive power. Jesus was not sending them out to tell others about Him in their own power. He was giving them the very same power He Himself possessed! And they were told to be His witnesses not only in the remotest part of the earth, but also right there in Jerusalem and in the nearby towns and villages! Being a missionary means we can witness for Christ in our own neighborhood! And we don't have to learn a foreign language, sleep in a pup tent, or fight mosquitoes. We can witness to people by opening our homes for a Bible Study or prayer group; by transporting people to doctor appointments; by praying with patients in a rehab facility; by baking

cookies or sweet breads for newcomers at church; and even by writing weekly articles for the church newsletters. We have been empowered by the Holy Spirit to be witnesses for Christ. What God-given talents does He want us to use---and where?

Praying in One Accord-When we discover how the Holy Spirit has empowered our God-given talents, we are ready to serve Him in one accord with His needs---whether at home or abroad.

Accord Prayer-Lord Christ, not all of us are needed in the remote parts of the earth; please show us where, when, and how we can best serve as Your witnesses. In Your Name we pray. Amen.

Prayer of Thanksgiving-Heavenly Father, You created each of us with a specific purpose in mind. Thank You for revealing that purpose and for empowering us to serve You whenever and wherever we are called to go. Amen.

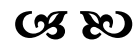
